


## The Number of Dual Enrollment Students Increased by 212% from 11,484 to 35,862, Fiscal Years 2013-2017


## **Dual Enrollment**



**Dual Enrollment** provides high school students with the opportunity to take college courses for both high school and college credit.

#### **Dual Enrollment Funding**

Eligible high school students enrolling in a participating college or university and taking approved college courses for both high school and college credit are eligible for funding through Georgia's **Dual Enrollment Program**.



# Dual Enrollment Definitions



**'Eligible high school student'** means a student entering 9th, 10th, 11th, or 12th grade an at eligible high school.



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**'Eligible high school'** means any private or public secondary educational institution located within Georgia and any home study program pursuant to Code Section 20-2-690.



'Dual credit course' means a postsecondary course taken by an eligible high school student at or through an eligible postsecondary institution for which the student receives secondary credit from his or her eligible high school.

## Student Expenses



Students *may* have some expenses:

- Course-related fees and materials required for a particular course (lab fees, materials, supplies, etc.)
- Fees that are optional to the student (parking, meal plan, room and board, graduation fee, etc.)
- Orientation fee, unless orientation is required
- Charges or fines incurred due to actions taken by the student (parking tickets, library fines, etc.)
- Lost or damaged book charges (cost of book minus the book allowance or \$75, whichever is less)



# High School Postsecondary Graduation Opportunity

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Students are awarded a high school diploma **and** college credential(s) after meeting all of the following:

- 1. Successful completion of the following state-required high school courses or their equivalent:
  - 2 English (9th Grade Lit. and Comp., American Lit. and Comp.)
  - 2 Math (Algebra 1, Geometry)
  - 2 Science (Biology, Physical Science or Physics)
  - 2 Social Studies (US History, Am. Gov./Economics)
  - 1 health and PE course (Health and Personal Fitness)
- 2. Completion of all required EOC exams
- 3. Completion of an Associate Degree, Technical Diploma or two Technical Certificates of Credit (TCC) in one specific career pathway that lead to industry certification or license.


## **HOPE Grant for High School Postsecondary Graduation Opportunity (SB2)**

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
#### **HOPE Grant**

Based on section 304.9, Alternative Graduation Option, of the 2017-2018 (FY 2018) Program Regulations, students graduating high school through the SB2 Option and who chose to pursue an associate degree under SB 186, will be identified in SURFER. Eligibility for the HOPE Grant in a student's first 30 semester hours of pursuing an associate degree at a Technical College System of Georgia institution will be indicated on the Student Demographics screen with a "Yes" indicator. Additionally, field 38 of the GAD file will be populated with a "Y", indicating yes.

## Eligible Georgia High Schools & Home Study Programs



- Private and public high schools within the state of Georgia must execute a <u>Dual Enrollment Four-Year High School Participation</u> <u>Agreement</u> with GSFC.
- Home study programs operated pursuant to O.C.G.A. 20-2-690 must execute a <u>Dual Enrollment</u> <u>Annual Home Study Program</u> <u>Participation Agreement</u> with GSFC.

## School Counselor Responsibilities



Provide general DE information by February 1 each year.

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- Provide student advisement and complete/sign-off on the Student Participation Agreement Form.
- Complete the counselor's portion of the online funding application.
- Students and Parents should be made aware of the local school system policy regarding the withdrawal from DE courses and impact on the student's transcript.
- Record courses and grades on student's transcript for dual enrollment credits earned.
- Encourage students to be mindful of deadlines and graduation requirements.

## Things to Know



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- Students must seek approval from their high school counselor before making changes to their college schedule.
- Participation may begin in fall of 9<sup>th</sup> grade year.
- A student's 12th grade year concludes at the end of the spring term after four years of the student's high school enrollment beginning in the 9th grade.
- Students may continue participation until they graduate high school even if their graduation requirements are satisfied early.
- Only degree level DE core courses can receive the .5 weight and meet the academic rigor course categories of the HOPE/Zell Scholarship.

### Things to Know



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
- Only full-time DE students are eligible to take PE at any USG institution. PE classes are not available to DE students at TCSG institutions. Students must check with private institutions for their policies.
- Algebra II is a prerequisite to take college level math through Dual Enrollment.
- High schools should be consistent with procedures, schedules, and expectations for DE students just as they are with non-DE students.
- Local systems earn and retain their FTE funding.

#### As of July 1, 2018:

 A student is eligible for the Dual Enrollment Program funding up to a TOTAL of 15 semester or 12 quarter hours per term. Full-time Enrollment is not a requirement.

\*Some colleges do not charge students tuition for any hours over 15 credit hours.

## DE Grading and Weights



- Grade Conversion local system determines conversion scale for the college letter grade.
- Grade Weight only <u>degree level core courses</u> receive a .5 weight, up to a maximum 4.0, and count as "academic rigor" courses for HOPE Scholarship.
- Class ranking local systems determine class rank and cannot exclude DE students from eligibility for valedictorian and salutatorian except for students moving in after their sophomore year and not taking any courses on site at the high school.
- DE passing grade of "D" at the college is up to the local system whether to accept it as passing grade or not.

## **GADOE** and FTE Requirements



- Dual enrollment students must have a minimum of 4 college Georgia's School Superintendent "Educating Georgia's Future" classes (with 12+ semester hours) to be considered full-time gadoe.org dual enrollment.
- Students who are not full-time dual enrollment must take enough classes between their high school and college to be considered full-time.
- The number of courses required depends on the high school schedule. For example:

6 period day = 6 classes
7 period day = 7 classes
4 block = 4 classes

College science course <u>labs</u> do not count in the above.

## Dual Enrollment Course Withdrawals



The eligible DE student should contact the high school
counselor for approval before <u>any</u> course is dropped or any schedule change is made during the semester or quarter.

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- Should a participating DE student choose to withdraw from a college course, the high school will make its best attempt to place that student in a corresponding high school course or online credit opportunity to meet course completion and graduation requirements.
- If no corresponding course or credit recovery opportunity is possible, the **local school system** shall determine how the course will be recorded as a withdrawal or incomplete on the student's transcript. The "Z" grade can be used.
- The high school must record all DE courses and grades on the high school transcript.

#### "Z" Grade



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
A grade of "Z" can be given when no final grade is expected, as in the case when a DE student withdraws from the college course and receives a "W" at the college.

Districts are to report all courses, including all DE courses completed or not, in the end-of-year Student Class file.

The "Z" grade allows for the documentation of the dropped DE class without penalizing the student with a failing grade.



## Questions Concerning Repeating Courses



- Can students take DE courses that are matched with high school courses students have already passed at the high school? Yes, as long as you use the course # with a letter embedded.
- Can DE students retake DE courses the student has already taken and passed to try and earn a better grade? Local school decision. A course can only count once for a graduation requirement.
- Can students retake DE courses they have failed? A local school decision.

### **Approved Postsecondary Courses**




- The Dual Enrollment Course Directory on GAfutures is the Coorgia's School Superintendent Official list of approved course alignments.

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- 27,000+ approved alignments are currently in the Directory.
- A postsecondary course must be aligned to a high school course to appear in the Directory.
- Postsecondary institutions must initiate alignment requests.
- High schools should contact their local college or university if an additional alignment is needed.
- GADOE reviews all <u>new</u> alignment requests. The complete review process can take several weeks (or longer).
- Newly approved course alignments are added weekly.
- Students should be <u>strongly</u> cautioned against enrolling in any course that does not appear in the Directory unless they are willing to pay for the course and do not need high school credit.





### **Tips for Selecting Courses**



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- The prerequisites listed in the Directory should be consulted.
- GATRACS (available on GAfutures) helps students identify courses that will transfer in Georgia.
- Students planning to attend a USG institution following high school graduation should consult the USG's <u>Staying on Course</u> document to ensure the USG's Required High School Curriculum (RHSC) is completed.
- Students starting at a TCSG institution with plans to transfer to a USG institution should consult the <u>TCSG-USG General Education</u> <u>Transfer Chart.</u>
- Only USG students participating in dual enrollment <u>full-time</u> are eligible to take a PE course and have it funded through the program.

### **Unique Dual Enrollment #s (1/6)**



**Challenge:** GADOE does not allow public high schools to list duplicate Georgia's School Superintendent "Educating Georgia's Future" courses on a student's high school transcript.

**Solution:** The PSI can request the creation of a "unique dual enrollment number" to give high schools another alignment option.

### **Example:**

- Student took 23.042 (Oral/Written Communication (Speech)) in high school.
- Student wants to take COMM 1110 (Public Speaking) through dual enrollment.
- But COMM 1110 is aligned to 23.042 in the Directory so would result in duplicate credit.

## Unique Dual Enrollment #s (2/6)



**Challenge:** Some PSI courses do not have a "comparable" high "Educating Georgia's School Superintendent school course.

**Solution:** "Unique dual enrollment numbers" can also be assigned when a postsecondary course does not have a high school alignment.

### **Example:**

- A USG institution offers PHYS 3143 (Quantum Mechanics) but there is not a comparable high school course for an alignment.
- The postsecondary can request the creation of a "unique dual enrollment number" for PHYS 3143 so the alignment can be included in the Directory.
